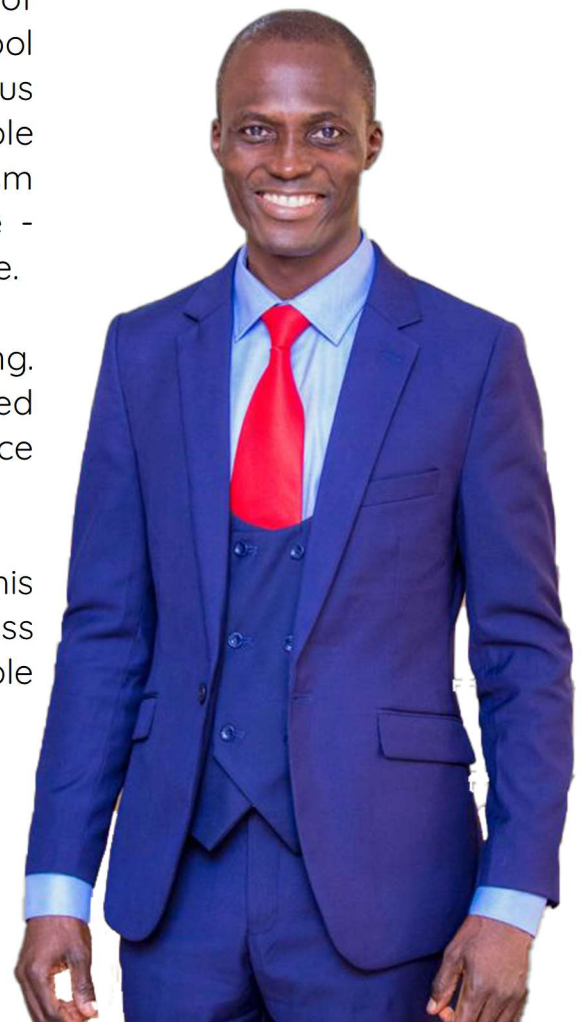
## Principal's Message

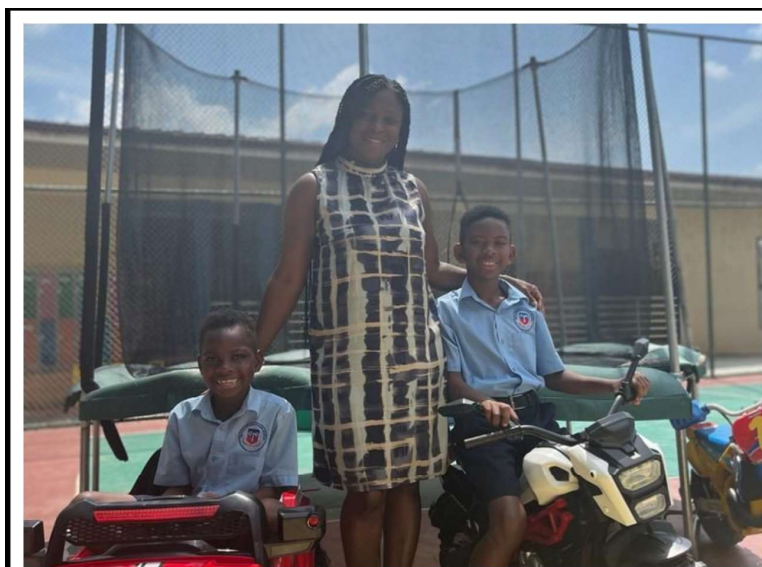


# Donations

Our sincere thanks go out to all our donors.

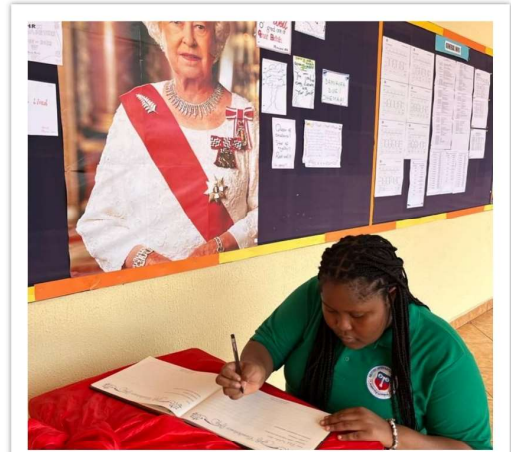


# Saying Farewell to the Queen of England (Queen Elizabeth II)

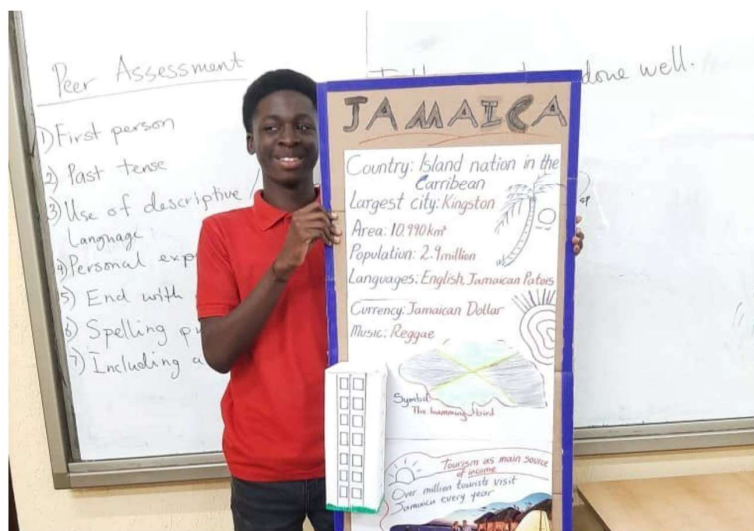




# Year 9 English Project on Travel Writing

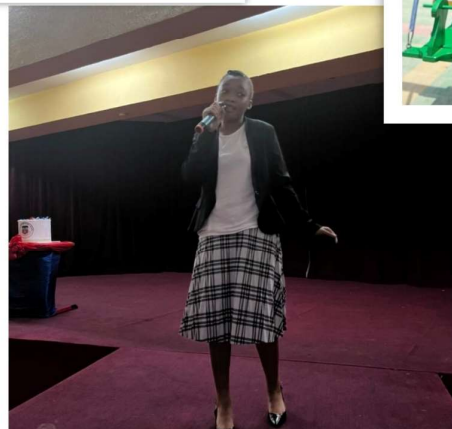
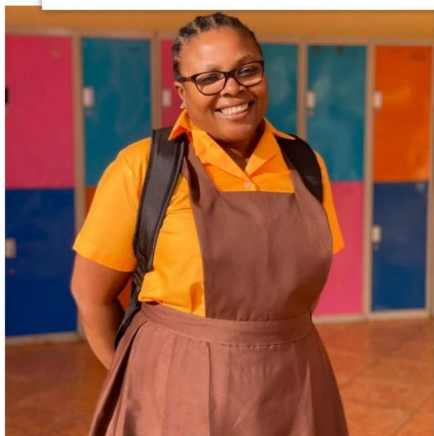
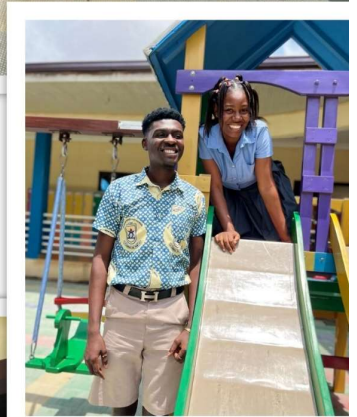
# World Teachers' Day

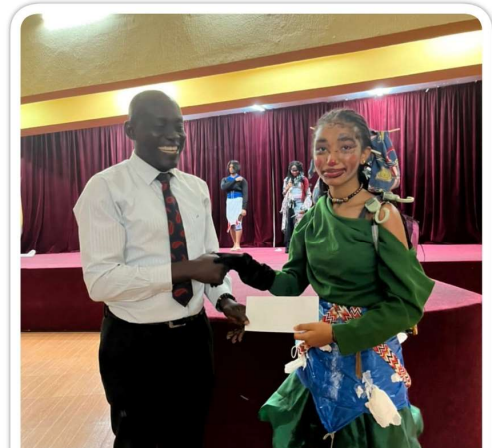

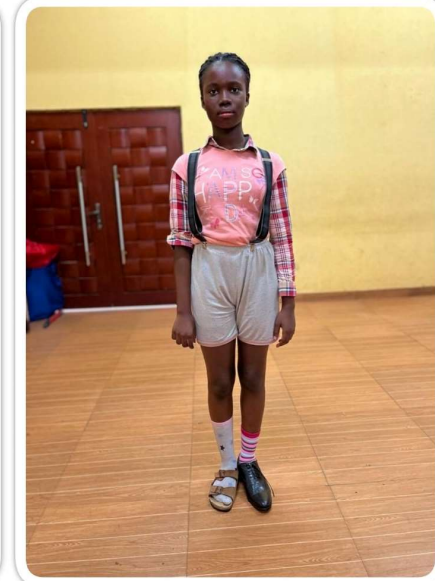
# SRC Week (10-10-2022 to 14-10-22)

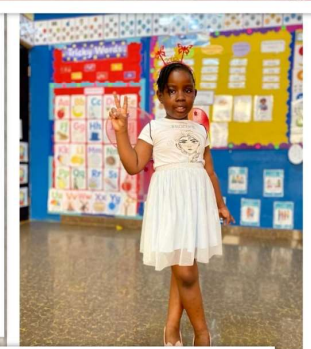
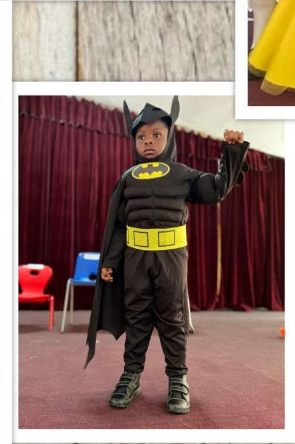
# Early Years Book Character Day

# STUDY TECHNIQUES - FEEDBACK FROM LEARNERS

After a couple of strategic meetings with candidates who are to write Cambridge Checkpoint, IGCSE and 'A' level Exams in 2023, the management of BIS came out with a plan to assist students to overcome most of the learning challenges. As part of the recommendations, Mr. Boateng was tasked to guide learners to plan effectively towards their studies as well as engage them in efficient and strategic study techniques.

The aftermath of the Learning skills and study techniques has been very encouraging and worth mentioning.

The following are the testimonies on the benefits students have derived from the sessions:



I would like to state that after the session with Mr. Boateng on the Study techniques and Learning skills, the one that worked perfectly for me is the **20% read and 80% recite method**.

After using this method for about 2 weeks, I have realized that my recollecting skills and my grades have improved. I have also developed keen interest in my studies in recent times.

In fact, this is something I would recommend every student does. It allows you to keep track of all the assignments, homework and notes for easy identification and revision.

I was also enthused by the recommendation of having a study plan and following assiduously to get better results. I must confess that since we started the exams, I have never felt the same as before. Finally, I would like to state unequivocally that the SQ3R (**S**urvey and skim through the notes, **Q**uestion yourself on what is learnt, **R**ead your notes, **R**ecite what you have learnt) strategy has been the most useful of the learning strategies. This makes for a very different learning experience and I am pretty confident that I would obtain very excellent results at the end of this autumn term exams.

# Remembrance Day

Over the weeks, you may have seen poppies on peoples' clothes, in shops, on learners' uniforms, or a BIS staff or learner may have asked you to purchase a poppy with proceeds to be donated to our gallant ex-soldiers. Why? After the First World War, the farms, fields, and land in France and Belgium were left devastated. Within these remnants of gloom, red poppies began to reappear on the abandoned battlefields. Since then, the poppy became a symbol of suffering and sacrifice made by brave soldiers.

The morning of Friday 11th November (marking the end of the War in 1918) 2022 was a solemn moment for our learners when they observed a minute silence in honour of the soldiers. Our Year 6 learners gave passionate presentations and speeches on the destructions of the Great War and the significance of poppies as a symbol of hope as told in the poem, *In Flanders Field*, by the Canadian physician - Colonel John McCrae. The poem was in remembrance of those who had died in the First World War.



# Parent Teacher Association (PTA) General Meeting
